

PROGRESS UPDATE #3

FLINT EAST BOULEVARD FORMER MGP SITE



Work completed between 6/6/2017 and 6/24/2017 includes the following:

- Continued receiving and mixing of cap materials.
- Continued dredging activities at the upstream end of the Work Area (see Picture No. 1). Instream dredging has occurred from the upstream extent of dredging to station (STA) 7+00, while bank removal has occurred from the upstream extent of dredging to STA 12+00. Design removal elevations have not yet been achieved.
- Dredged sediments were mixed with dewatering amendment in a dewatering pad, and dewatered sediment was loaded into haul trucks for disposal at the approved landfill for the project.
- Continued collection of construction monitoring data including air, odor and construction noise monitoring; turbidity monitoring; and, structural monitoring (see Picture No. 2).
- Treatment of decant water from dredged sediment through the wastewater treatment system.
- Inspection of Work Area barriers, absorbent booms, and turbidity controls on a daily basis (see Picture No. 3).
- Initial surveying activities to verify that dredging has been completed to the design dredge surface (see Picture No. 4).

Upcoming work includes the following:

- Continue instream dredging and bank removal activities.
- Continue to mix cap materials.
- Continue to collect construction monitoring data.
- Achieve final design elevations between the upstream extent of dredging and STA 7+00 and begin capping activities.
- Begin demolition of the Pedestrian Bridge.
