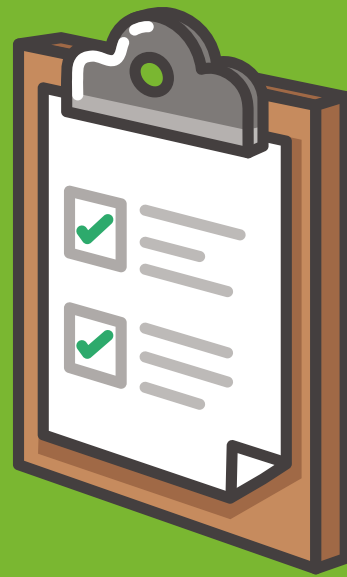
Your First Step: Call Consumers Energy

Paycheck Protection Program

On April 23, Congress provided more funds for PPP, which offers forgivable loans to small businesses to help pay employees during the COVID-19 crisis. The funds — which can cover up to eight weeks of payroll and other costs such as rent and utilities — are primarily available to companies with up to 500 employees. The most recent stimulus sets aside \$60 billion for community banks and smaller lenders to help small business customers.

The Small Business Administration provides working capital loans of up to \$2 million for vital economic support to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue small businesses are experiencing.
