Easements & Permits



- Easements: Rights on private and public property
- Permits: Needed in road ROW from government entities
- Easements and Permits
 Require Consumers Energy to
 get permission from others
- Both can often delay new construction

What is an Easement?

Easements are the right to use a portion of another person's property for a specific purpose.

Consumers Energy or the home owner is obligated to obtain easements in order to construct on another person's property.






You Can Help with Easements

Easement Example




Secure the Route

 Energy may be able to design using a different route




What is the ROW? What are Permits?



- Road right-of-way (ROW):
 An area of land that surrounds roads that is reserved for public purposes.
- ROW Permit: One type of permit that grants legal authorization to install and maintain gas and electric utilities along public roads
